#### **Pupil Asset App**

Some important updates are being made to the Pupil Asset payments system that we use. We have been contacted by the company at very short notice regarding some changes being implemented as a result of new legislation in the banking system whereby two factor authentication is required by banks. You may have seen more of this in your day to day banking recently.

The updates and improvements that are being made may mean payments via the app will be intermittent for a period of time. They are hoping for this to be a matter of days but it could place restrictions on the app for up to 3 weeks. During this time they request that:

- Parents use the web portal to make payments where possible <u>Parent Portal (see</u> guide attached)
- Parents using the app only, make payments for all items expected between now and the end of the Easter holiday
- If you are unable to pay via the app and cannot use the web portal, payments may be made by card at the school office.

We have fed back to Pupil Asset our dissatisfaction regarding the lack of notice period in relation to this information. They have apologised but were expecting the updates to be successful sooner.
