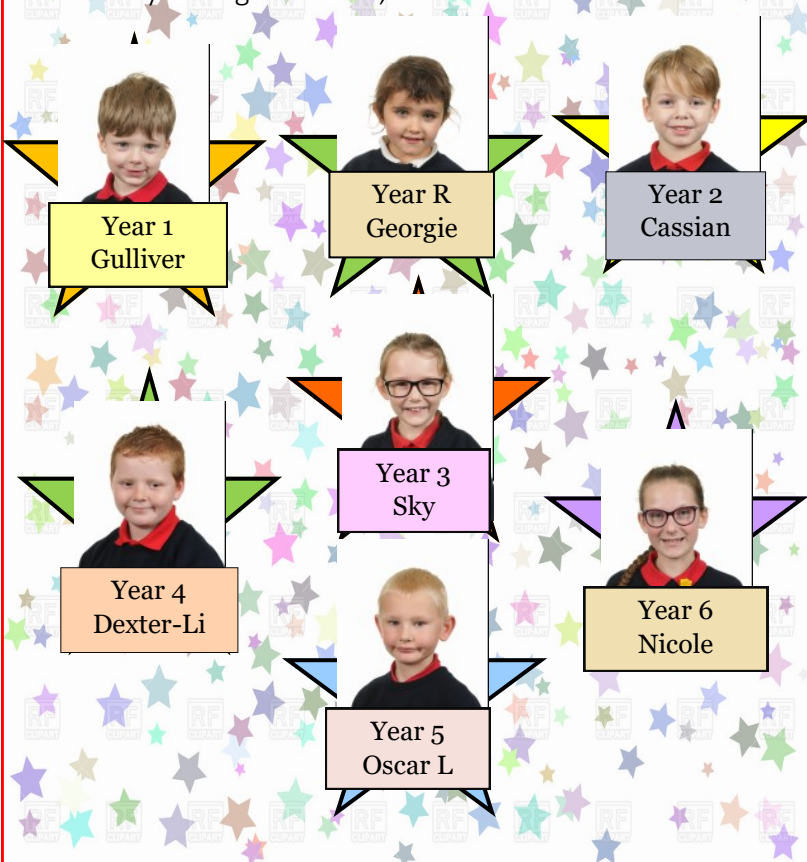

Ted will go to Fletcher in KS1 with 88.3% attendance and Walliams in KS2 with 96.9%, they are the proud keepers of Ted!

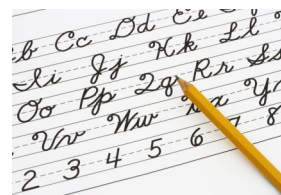
